Dr. Laura M. Stapleton is an assistant professor in the psychology department at the University of Maryland, Baltimore County. She received her Ph.D. in measurement, statistics and evaluation from the University of Maryland, a M.Ed. in curriculum and instruction from George Mason University and B.A. in economics from the University of Michigan. She has been involved in statistical analysis, evaluation and survey methods work since her start as an Economist with the U.S. Department of Labor in 1988. She worked for more than a decade in higher education evaluation and research: from 1990 to 1994 she served as a research associate at the American Association of State Colleges and Universities and from 1995 to 2001 she was the Associate Director of Institutional Research at the University of Maryland, College Park. From 2001 to 2005 she held the position of assistant professor in quantitative methods in the department of educational psychology at the University of Texas. Her main interests and publications are in the study of statistical methods for accommodating data from complex sampling designs, specifically in the use of structural equation modeling techniques.
