

Steeh, Charlotte

Charlotte Steeh is an Independent Consultant on Survey Methodology whose research has focused for the last several years on the new communication technologies that are affecting telephone surveys of the general population. As a member of the faculty at Georgia State University from 1997 - 2005, she was director of the Survey Research Laboratory in the Andrew Young School of Policy Studies, director of the Survey Research Project, and associate research professor in the Department of Public Administration and Urban Studies. Prior to that she directed the Detroit Area Study at the University of Michigan for six years and lectured in the Department of Sociology. She received her graduate education at the University of Michigan obtaining her doctorate in 1975. In addition to her efforts to measure trends in nonresponse, she has sought procedures that will integrate mobile telephones into random digit dial samples and lately has extended her research to include Voice over Internet Protocol (VoIP). Her research has been supported by the National Science Foundation and the Federal Committee on Statistical Methodology.
