Peter Lynn is professor of Survey Methodology at the Institute for Social and Economic Research, University of Essex, UK. His research interests include all aspects of quantitative survey methodology, including sampling, weighting and estimation, nonresponse, response maximization techniques, mode effects and measurement errors, as well as frameworks and standards for survey quality. He has been editor of the *Journal of the Royal Statistical Society Series A (Statistics in Society)* and *Survey Research Methods*. Recent publications include books on *Survey Research Practice* (Sage, 2008 forthcoming) and *Methodology of Longitudinal Surveys* (Wiley, 2008 forthcoming), and articles in *Journal of Official Statistics*, *Survey Methodology*, *Journal of the Royal Statistical Society*, and *International Journal of Social Research Methodology*.
